

VALUE YOUR VOTE – VOTER TURNOUT EXPECTATIONS, PLANNING, and ACCOUNTABILITY

OVERVIEW

Goal: To equip and resource churches to increase voter turnout in their own congregation by 20-30%.

Recent scientific studies presented at Stanford University showed some surprising results about what motivates people to vote:

- 1. **EXPECTATIONS:** Voters are more motivated to go to the polls when they know that their peers are voting and are told that voter turnout is expected to be high.
- 2. **PLANNING:** Voters are more likely to vote when they are encouraged to make a definite logistical plan for getting to the polls on Election Day.
- 3. **ACCOUNTABILITY:** Voters are more inclined to vote when they know that someone is going to follow up with them after the election to find out if they voted.

Step 1: Appoint a Volunteer Coordinator.

Step 2: Determine the voter status of your congregation.

We can do a data-match using your member list, or you can use our texting tool to poll your congregation. We'll walk you through either process. Note: This step needs to take place as soon as possible!

Step 3: Schedule a Voter Registration Sunday.
